At Pineville Pediatrics we believe in the safety and effectiveness of childhood immunizations to prevent serious illness, disability and even death. We along with AAP strongly endorse universal immunizations as being one of the most important health promoting interventions we can perform.

Pineville Pediatrics understands that the decision to vaccinate your child can be challenging but rest assured we will provide you with the necessary information to aid you in deciding to vaccinate your child. However once you decide to vaccinate your child please be advised that “spreading vaccines out” over multiple visits puts your child at risk for illness, injury even death and it goes against our policy. Additional visits may also require additional co-pays on your part.

If after careful consideration you absolutely refuse to create a plan by 2 months, initiate the plan by the 4th month and complete the primary series by 2 years of age (for newborns) or if a catch-up plan (for older children) is not initiated by 2 months of being a part of our practice you will be asked to find another pediatrician who shares your views.

Please understand that at Pineville Pediatrics your child’s health as well as the health of our community is our priority and immunizing your child is the right thing to do.
